## 2015-2016 IAVM SLATE OF OFFICERS



Board Chair: Karen Totaro, CFE

Karen Totaro, CFE is the General Manager of the Atlantic City Convention Center for Spectra (formerly Global Spectrum), a leader in private venue management. Totaro relocated from Cincinnati where she held the position of Assistant General Manager at the Duke Energy Convention Center which was also proudly managed by Spectra. Prior to Cincinnati Totaro served as the Assistant Executive Director at the Oregon Convention Center in Portland for nine years and the Associate Director at the University of Dayton Arena in Dayton, Ohio for five years. She started in the business at the University of Illinois in Champaign/Urbana as the Marketing Manager for the Assembly Hall Arena.

During her career Totaro has had an active role in the International Association of Venue Managers (IAVM) by serving in several capacities which have included: 1st and 2nd Vice Chair of the Board of Directors which equates to two years on the Executive Committee, District 4 Regional Director, a seat on the Board of Governors, Chair of the Transition Committee, Chair of the Education Council, Chair of the Board Development Committee, a member of the Allied Task Force and two years as a member of the Board of Trustees. The roles noted included three terms on the IAVM Board of Directors. Planning regional Conferences became a great asset when she was asked to Chair the VenueConnect Planning Committee for 2014 in Portland.

Totaro is a graduate of the University of Illinois. In addition she is a graduate of the Public Assembly Facility Management School. She completed the three-year Senior Executive Symposium in 2007 and received her Certified Facilities Executive distinction in 2009.

Second Vice Chair: Doug Booher, CFE

Doug Booher, CFE currently serves as Director of Indiana University Auditorium and Major University Events. Known for its presentation of a wide variety of events from university ceremonies and conference events to the latest Rock shows and Broadway attractions, this 3,200 seat proscenium facility has been a model of campus and community programming and engagement since it was built in 1941. In 2010, IU Event Services was created to provide event staffing, management and consulting for major university events including all IU Athletics events at Assembly Hall, Memorial Stadium and Bill Armstrong Stadium. As an integral facet of the university community, IU Auditorium and IU Event Services thrive on student involvement and participation. Each year, over 1000 IU students work in volunteer, internship, and hourly employment roles within the organization. Together, IU Auditorium and Event Services serve nearly one million visitors each year.

Throughout his nineteen year career in venue management Booher has presented extensively in the areas of guest service, event management and artist contract negotiation and serves as an adjunct lecturer in IU's School of Public and Environmental Affairs.

Booher joined IAVM in 1996 and is a graduate of the Public Assembly Facility Management School (now VMS) at Oglebay. He earned his Certified Facilities Executive (CFE) designation in 2010.



Past Chair: Kim Bedier, CFE

Kim Bedier, CFE is Director of Public Assembly Facilities for the City of Tacoma where her portfolio includes the Tacoma Dome, Greater Tacoma Convention and Trade Center, Cheney Stadium and the Pantages, Rialto and Theatre on the Square historic theaters. She has over 25 years of venue leadership experience, including Comcast Arena at Everett (the inaugural Venue Excellence Award winner for Arenas), Air Canada Centre in Toronto and Crystal Centre in Grande Prairie Alberta.

Bedier has served on the IAVM Foundation Board of Trustees, Membership Committee, Facility Manager Editorial Advisory Board, as Chair of the Venue Management School Board of Regents and Arenas Committee, and on the executive committees of IAVM and of IAVM Region 4. Director – Region 1: Jason E. Poppe

In his current role as the Director of Events and Operations with Georgetown University Athletics, Jason Poppe oversees operations for all home athletic events. Poppe is also heavily involved with the operation of the athletic facilities on-campus and coordinates off-site rental of leased competition sites for multiple athletic programs.

Previously, Poppe has worked at The American University, The University of Chicago, The Gazelle Group, Inc., University of Connecticut and University of Maryland in various events and operations roles.

Poppe is currently involved with IAVM as Director for Region 1 and is additionally involved with the Universities Committee. A 2013 graduate of Venue Management School, he hopes to continue his professional development through the various offerings of IAVM.

Cook relocated from Edmonton, Alberta, Canada, where he held the position of General Manager for Rexall Place and the Edmonton EXPO Centre at Northlands. It also manages the Jerry Richardson Stadium (15,300 seats), home to Charlotte 49ers football.

Dohnt has 25 years' experience in the venue industry, moving from Adelaide in 1987 to take up a position with Tennis Australia at the then newly constructed Tennis Centre in Melbourne. In a 10-year stint with Tennis Australia, he held positions of Finance Director and later Chief General Manager - being responsible for not only the development and promotion of the game in Australia, but also the conduct of the highly successful Australian Open, from where he was appointed Venue Manager of the National Tennis Centre.

Director - Allied: Leslie Taylor

Director - Arenas: Todd Hunt, CFE

From 1999-2007, he served as the Director of Humphrey Coliseum and Athletic Concessions for Mississippi State University. Hunt's first general manager position was from 1997-99 at the Tupelo Coliseum, where he negotiated the first venue naming rights deal in the state of Mississippi while also bringing professional sports (ice hockey and indoor soccer) to the area for the first time. Director - Universities: Marty Elliott

Elliott, who is the first person to hold the position in the school's history, oversees the operations of the 88-acre KSU Sports and Entertainment Park. KSU is the second largest university in the state of Georgia and is located in Metro Atlanta.

Prior to Kennesaw State, Elliott spent 11 years as Director of Major Events and Business Development for Clemson University. In that role, she managed university venues such as Littlejohn Coliseum, Tillman Theatre, Bowman Field and the Hendrix Student Center.
