Chair of the Board: Brett Mitchell, CVE

Brett C. Mitchell, CVE is General Manager of the Overland Park Convention Center.

In 2010, motivated to spend more time with his children, Mitchell resigned his position as Vice President of Convention Center Operations for Global Spectrum (now Oak View Group), choosing to return as General Manager of the Overland Park Convention Center.

Within the past five years Exhibitor Magazine named Overland Park Convention Center the Best Small Convention Center in North America three times and once Best Customer Service & On-Site Support for centers of any size.

Mitchell earned a Sports Business Management degree from Brigham Young University and later served on the Industry Advisory Council for the school's Facility Management Program. First Vice Chair: Matt Hollander, CVE

Matt Hollander, CVE has been a member of IAVM since 1992 and earned his CVE in 2009. In his current role, Hollander works for Oak View Group as the General Manager of the Greenville (SC) Convention Center.
